



Lexi Speight was an exuberant and hilariously funny 8-year old.

After complaining of a "tummy ache" Lexi was diagnosed with liver cancer and died just 12 weeks later. There were no other indications -- the doctors called it an unexplainable "lightning strike."

That was 11 years ago.

*Cancer remains the 2nd leading cause of death for children. Through **Laps for Lexi**, the Speight family is reversing this statistic and giving other children and their families hope.*

Since Lexi's death in 2010, over 8,000 people have participated in the **Laps for Lexi** annual 5K run/walk that raises money for both pediatric cancer and a scholarship in Lexi's name.

In the past 11 years, **Laps for Lexi** has raised over \$1.1M for Children's National Medical Center - **Lexi Speight Chair in Pediatric Oncology** and the **Lexi Speight scholarship** at Sandy Spring Friends School.

It's more than just the money raised. **Laps for Lexi** has energized a community; we've raised awareness about children's cancer; we've helped improve the quality of life of children. But our work isn't done. We have more to do ... and you do too.
